

### PROPOSALS RECEIVED & FUNDS DISBURSED:

Since the beginning of 2013, ERF in oPt has received 13 project proposals for a total amount of US\$ 2,519,336 these include:

- 11 proposals for projects in the Gaza strip.
- 2 proposals in the West Bank.

- 7 proposals from International NGOs
- 5 proposals from National NGOs.
- 1 proposal from UN agencies.

Of them

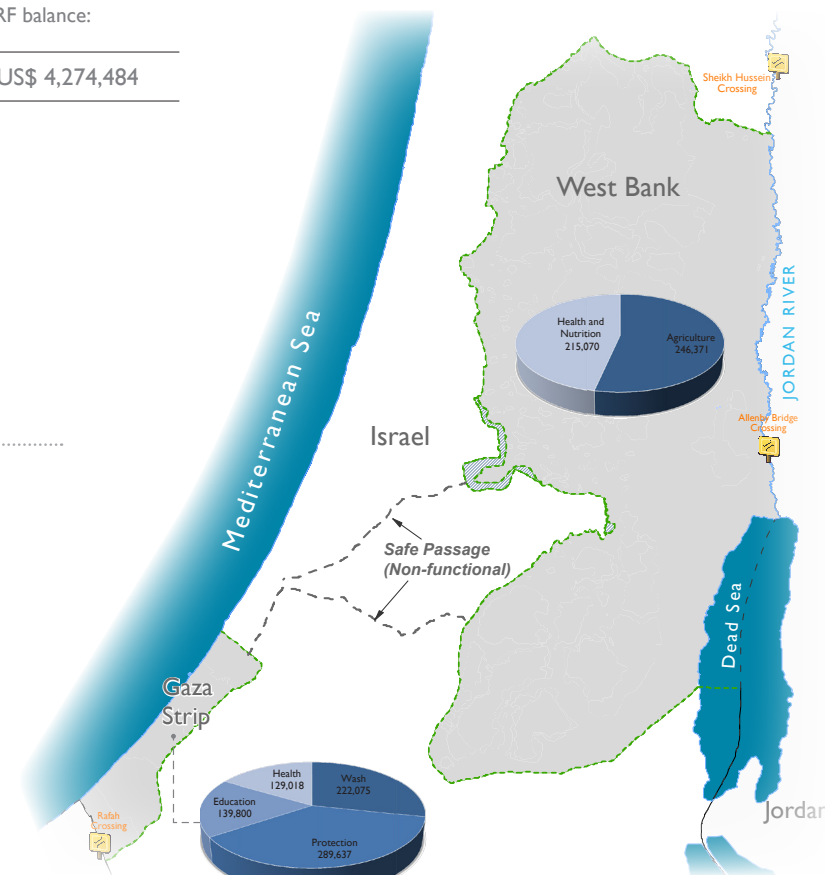
- 5 proposals from Agriculture sector.
- 2 proposals from Emergency Shelter and NFIs cluster
- 1 proposal from Health and nutrition cluster.
- 1 proposal from Education.
- 3 proposals from Protection.
- 1 proposal from Wash.

Seven projects were approved to address needs for Wash, Health & nutrition, Agriculture, Protection and Education. Of them 1 project implemented by UN agencies, 2 projects implemented directly by NNGOs, 3 project implemented directly by INGO, in addition to 1 project implemented in partnership between National and International NGOs for total amount US\$ 1,241,970

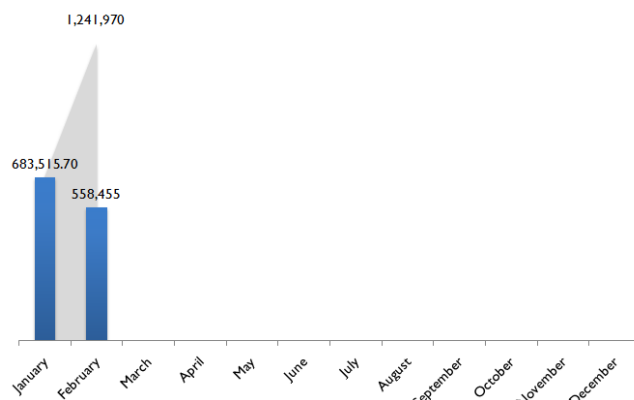
### Funds disbursed by region, and cluster in the occupied Palestinian territory

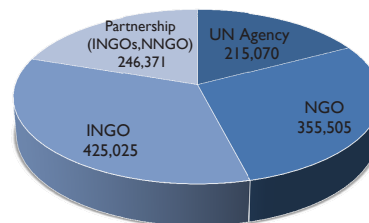

 <b>WASH</b>	0	1	<b>222,075</b>	-Emergency dewatering and cleaning of wastewater lagoons at Bait Lahia and Rafah wastewater treatment plants.
 <b>Agricultural/ Livestock interventions</b>	1	0	<b>246,370.71</b>	-Supporting the farmers of the vulnerable communities of Bethlehem, Hebron, Jenin, Salfit and Nablus districts, suffered demolitions with emergency agricultural structures replacement.
 <b>HEALTH</b>	1	1	<b>344,080</b>	-To procure and deliver to the MoH 30,000 doses of influenza vaccine to protect the most vulnerable groups of the immunocompromized patients and health workers at hospitals -To provide clinical and therapeutic services through different community centers in addition to running the free telephone counseling service, to alleviate the effects of the Israeli offensive and tries to improve the psychological wellbeing of the Gazans.
 <b>EDUCATION</b>	0	2	<b>139,800</b>	-Immediate repair of dangerous damage in 17 government schools in East Khan Younis and Middle Area as a result of the recent Gaza crisis of November 2012 -Mitigate the negative impacts on educational attainment associated with trauma and provide teachers with practical skills to work with children on this issue.
 <b>PROTECTION</b>	0	3	<b>289,637</b>	-To ensure that children who have been traumatised or re-traumatised by the escalation in hostilities during November 2012 are provided with sufficient and timely support to mitigate the effects of the trauma. -To provide psychological support for the most affected people especially children, and also focusing on training other professionals from local organizations to enable them provide the basic service of psychological support. -Fasten and enhance the survival, recovery, re-engagement, adaptation and psychosocial wellbeing of the traumatized 2012 Israeli offensive induced and existing people with disabilities.
