

				- Mitigate the negative impacts on educational attainment associated with trauma and provide teachers with practical skills to work with children on this issue.
	0	5	581,661	- To ensure that children who have been traumatised or re-traumatised by the escalation in hostilities during November 2012 are provided with sufficient and timely support to mitigate the effects of the trauma.
				- To provide psychological support for the most affected people especially children. Training professionals from local organizations to enable them to provide the basic service of psychological support.
				- Fasten and enhance the survival, recovery, re-engagement, adaptation and psychosocial wellbeing of people traumatized in November 2012 hostilities and people with disabilities.
				- Improve public awareness level in terms of protection and wellbeing of vulnerable persons including women, youth and children and provide them with tools and information that enable them to best cope with traumatic events and psychological problems generated by the hostilities.
				- Psychological support for women displaced after November 2012 escalation of hostilities in the Gaza Strip.
